PUBLIC NOTICE TO INTERESTED PERSONS ENTITLED TO SIGN A REQUEST TO PARTICIPATE IN A REFERENDUM

SECOND DRAFT BY-LAW NUMBER 116-3-2021 ADOPTED UNDER BY-LAW NUMBER 116-1 AND ENTITLED « BY-LAW AMENDING SUBDIVISION BY-LAW NUMBER 116-1 AS AMENDED, IN ORDER TO ADD ARTICLE 2.11 »

Notice is hereby given, to interested persons and organizations entitled to sign an application to participate in a referendum:

1. Adoption of the second draft by-law

Following a written consultation held from March 15, 2022, to March 30, 2022, the Municipal Council of the Town of Sutton adopted, at a regular meeting held on April 6, 2022, under resolution number 2022-04-134, the second draft of By-Law number 116-3-2021 entitled « By-Law amending Subdivision By-Law number 116-1 as amended, in order to add article 2.11 ». The second draft was adopted with changes to the text to clarify and simplify it by separating section 2.11 into points.

This second draft resolution contains provisions that can be the subject of a request from interested persons asking it to be submitted for their approval in accordance with the *Municipal Elections and Referendums Act*.

2. Provisions that can receive a request

The purpose of this second draft resolution is to insert a provision relating to the minimum area of a lot covered by paragraph 10) of section 53 of chapter 7 of the Permits and Certificates By-law number 251 regarding the condition for the issuance of a building permit for lots located within the perimeters delimited in schedules 1 and 2 of the Permits and Certificates By-law number 251.

3. Description of the zones concerned and the contiguous zones

An application relating to this provision may originate from the zones concerned and the zones that are contiguous to it. The zones concerned are found in part or entirely within the perimeters set out in Schedules 1 and 2 of the Permits and Certificates By-law Number 251:

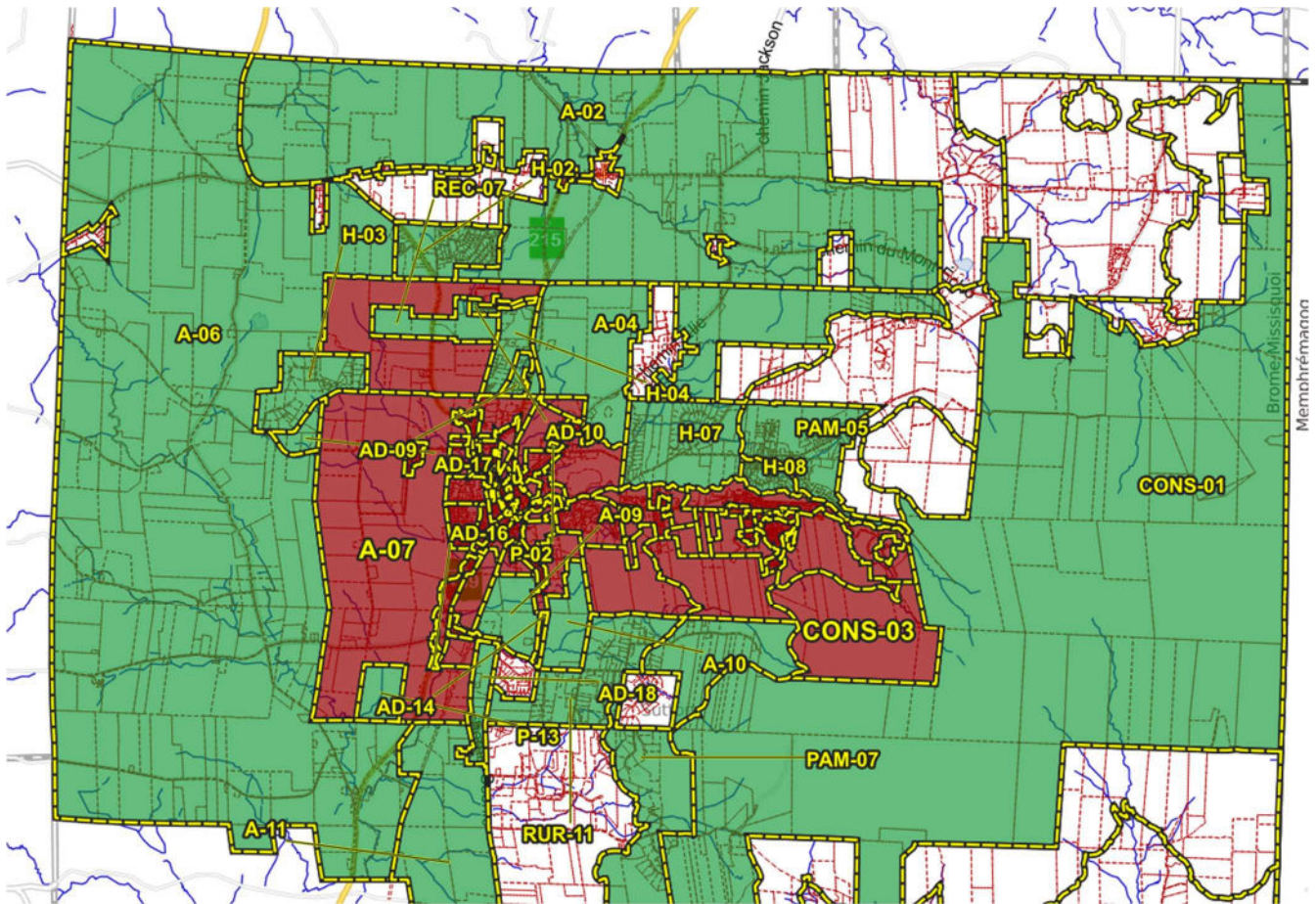

4. Conditions for a valid request

To be valid, the request must:

1. Be delivered to the Town by April 22, 2022, by mail or deposited in the Town's drop box and addressed to:

or sent by e-mail to ville@sutton.ca, no later than April 22, 2022, with the subject line "Application for participation in a referendum / 116-3-2021".

2. Clearly identify the provision that is the subject of the application and the area from which it originates and indicate the area to which the application applies.
3. Be signed by at least 12 interested persons in the area from which it originates or by at least most of them if the number of interested persons in the area from which it originates does not exceed 21.



An interested person is any person who is not disqualified from voting under section 524 of the Act Respecting Elections and Referendums in municipalities (R.S.Q., chapter E-2.2) and who meets the following conditions on April 6, 2022:

a) is of full age, a Canadian citizen and is not under the curatorship.

b) is a natural person and has been domiciled in a zone from which an application may be made and, for at least six months, in Quebec.

OR;

has been, for at least 12 months, the owner of an immovable or the occupant of a business establishment, within the meaning of the Act respecting municipal taxation (R.S.Q., chapter F-2.1), located in a zone from which an application may be made.

c) in the case of undivided co-owners of an immovable or occupants of a place of business, the person entitled to sign the application on their behalf must be designated by means of a power of attorney signed by most of the co-owners or co-occupants.

d) in addition, in the case of a corporation, it must designate by resolution a person who, on April 6, 2022 is of the age of majority and a Canadian citizen and is not under the curatorship, as one of its members, directors and employees.

Any provision of the second draft resolution for which no valid request is made may be included in a resolution that does not require approval by those entitled to vote.
