

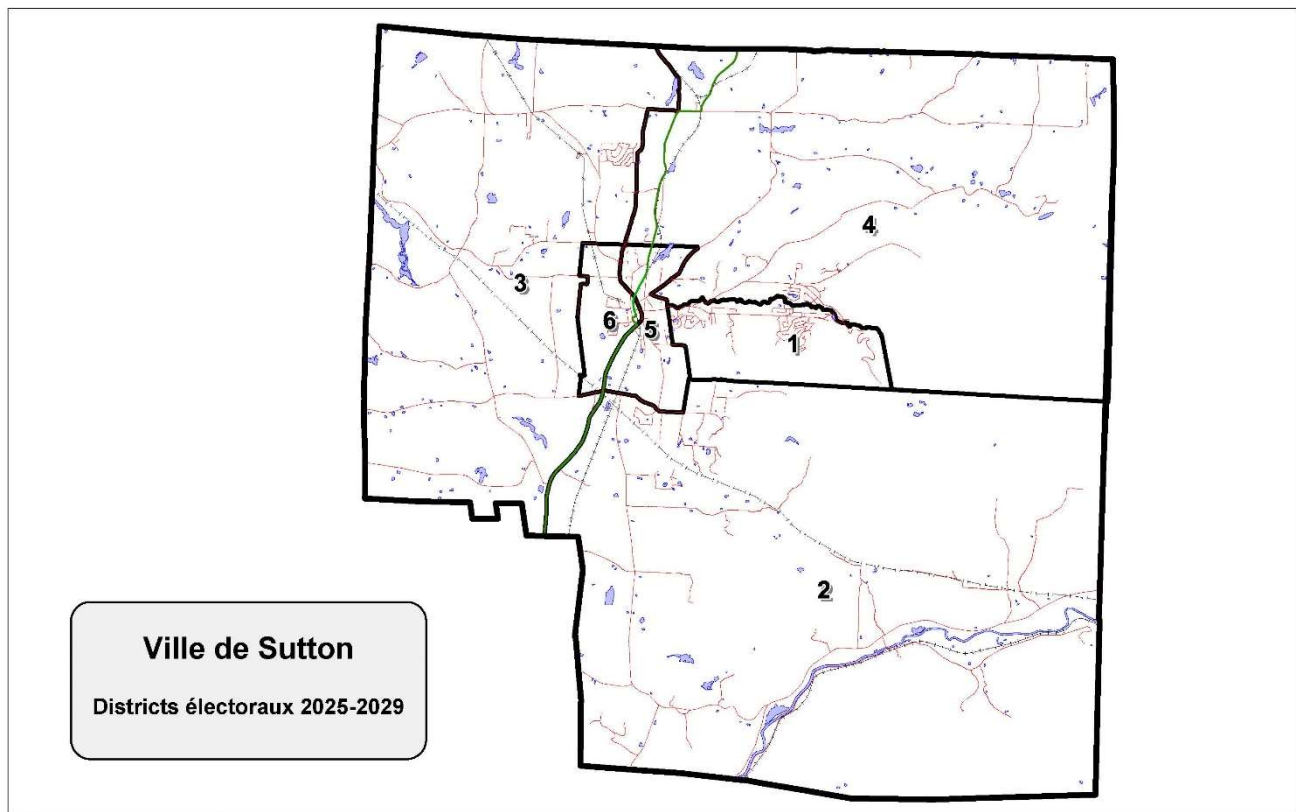


PUBLIC NOTICE

RENEWAL OF THE BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWN'S TERRITORY INTO ELECTORAL DISTRICTS

NOTICE is hereby given that, on April 9th, 2024 the *Commission de la représentation électorale* confirmed that the Town of Sutton meets the conditions to renew the division of the territory of the Town into six (6) electoral districts, each represented by a municipal councillor and delimited in order to ensure a balance as for the number of voters in each one of them and as for their socio-economic homogeneity.

The electoral districts are defined as follows:

And each district has the following number of voters:

ELECTORAL DISTRICT NUMBER 1	636 voters
ELECTORAL DISTRICT NUMBER 2	692 voters
ELECTORAL DISTRICT NUMBER 3	743 voters
ELECTORAL DISTRICT NUMBER 4	852 voters
ELECTORAL DISTRICT NUMBER 5	792 voters
ELECTORAL DISTRICT NUMBER 6	681 voters

NOTICE is also given that, in accordance with section 40.1 to 40.4 of the *Act respecting elections and referendums in municipalities* (CQLR, c. E-2.2) any elector may, within fifteen (15) days of the publication of this notice, or by May 10, 2024, make known in writing its opposition to the renewal of the division of the territory of the Town into electoral districts. This letter of objection must be mailed, deposited in the Town Hall drop-off box or sent by email and addressed to:

NOTICE is also given that, in accordance with sections 40.5 and 18 of the *Act respecting elections and referendums in municipalities* (CQLR, c. E-2.2), the clerk must inform the *Commission de la représentation électorale* if the Town has received, within the time limit, a number of opponents which is equal to or greater than one hundred (100) voters. In this case, the Town must follow the procedure for dividing the territory of the municipality into electoral districts provided for in *Section III* of the Act.
