



**BY-LAW NO 222 ENTITLED  
« BY-LAW CONCERNING THE COLLECTION OF GARBAGE IN THE TOWN OF  
SUTTON'S TERRITORY »**

On November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2012, Town of Sutton modified its by-law concerning the collection of garbage in its territory. As mentioned in this by-law and in the Info-Sutton of August 10<sup>th</sup> and October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2012, the collection of garbage will be done with wheeled bins. Therefore, the wooden boxes and bags left out on the side of the road will no longer be accepted after **December 21<sup>st</sup>, 2012.**

Only the wheeled bins made of plastic of any color, except for blue, with a capacity of 360 litres or 240 litres will be authorized to dispose of your garbage; therefore allowing the collection of your waste materials. A group of housing may receive the collection service with a metallic container by making a written request to the Town.

The wheeled bins must be put out between 7:00p.m. the night before and 7:00a.m. on the fixed day of the collection. The wheeled bins must be returned within eight (8) hours following the collection of the garbage or at the latest by 9:00p.m. on the fixed day of the collection. The day of the collection, the wheeled bins must be placed on the side of the public road, the handles in the direction of the building. The cover of the wheeled bin must be free to be opened, therefore there must be nothing (rocks, etc.) placed on top of the cover and should not be tied up. If there is more than one (1) wheeled bin on the side of the road, they must be spaced out by 600 mm (2 feet) minimum. The bins must be free of obstacles in the same perimeter. In addition, a wheeled bin will not be emptied if the weight exceeds 91 kg (200 lbs.), if it is inaccessible, and if it is placed at more than 1,5 meters (5 feet) from the side of the public road or if it contains materials that are not acceptable.

During the storing of the wheeled bin, it must be situated two (2) meters from the property line, from the front margin.

Please take note that the household hazardous wastes (HHW), the information and communications technologies (ICT) and the materials from construction, renovations and residential demolition (CRD) can be disposed of at the Eco-centre of the Brome-Missisquoi solid waste municipal board at 2500 rang St-Joseph in Cowansville. A proof of residency of the MRC Brome-Missisquoi will be required and certain fees can be requested depending on the materials. ## Annexes

The following materials are not acceptable during the collection of garbage:

- 1- Waste generated outside of Quebec;
- 2- Dangerous materials (see Annex 1);
- 3- The residual materials in the liquid state at 20°C;
- 4- Pesticides;
- 5- Biomedical wastes;
- 6- Contaminated soils;
- 7- Recyclable wastes;
- 8- Manure, putrid faeces, litter from stables, barns & poultry, animal carcasses ;
- 9- Wastes composed of or soaked of gasoline, hydrocarbons or other flammable or explosive substances, the ashes of forges or furnaces;
- 10- Explosives, explosive weapons, dynamite, rockets, bullets or grenades;
- 11- Tires (see Annex 3);
- 12- Motor vehicle parts or bodies;
- 13- Household hazardous wastes - HHW (Annex 1);
- 14- Information and communications technologies - ICT (Annex 2);
- 15- Materials from construction, renovations and residential demolition - CRD (Annex 3).
