① If you were a girl in the 19th century, what would you be learning at convent school in order to prepare for marriage?

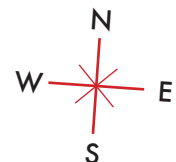
② Look at the old photos of the Sisters of the Presentation of Mary convent on the panel; name three differences between it then and now.
