REGISTRATION OF QUALIFIED VOTERS

By-Law number 285 entitled « By-Law decreeing an expense of \$ 1,316,670 and a loan of \$ 1,316,670 for the purchase of trucks and equipment for the Public Works service »

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN:

TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS ENTITLED TO BE REGISTERED ON THE REFERENDUM LIST OF THE WHOLE MUNICIPALITY:

1. That at the meeting held April 3rd, 2018, the Municipal Council of the Town of Sutton adopted By-Law number 285 entitled « By-Law decreeing an expense of \$ 1,316,670 and a loan of \$ 1,316,670 for the purchase of trucks and equipment for the Public Works service ».
2. The object of the said By-Law is to authorize an expense and a loan in order to proceed with a loan needed to purchase trucks and equipment which is required for the Public Works service.
3. Qualified voters entitled to be registered on the referendum list of the municipality may ask that By-Law number 285 be the subject of a referendum poll entering their name, address and capacity in an open register for this purpose. (*Qualified voters wishing to register their name must present an identity card: health insurance card, driver's licence or passport*).
4. The number of applications needed to require that a referendum poll be held regarding By-Law number 285 is 482. If this number is not reached, By-Law number 285 is deemed to be approved by the qualified voters.
5. The By-Law may be consulted at the Town of Sutton's office located at the Town Hall, 11 South Principale Street, Sutton (Quebec).
6. The register will be open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. on May 4th, 2018, at the Town Hall located at 11 South Principale Street, Sutton (Quebec).
7. The result of the register procedure will be announced at 7:05 p.m., on May 4th, 2018, in the council room at the Town Hall located at 11 South Principale Street, Sutton (Quebec).

CONDITIONS TO BE A QUALIFIED VOTER HAVING THE RIGHT TO BE ENTERED ON THE REFERENDUM LIST OF THE WHOLE MUNICIPALITY

8. Any person who, on April 3rd, 2018, is not disqualified from voting in accordance with article 524 of the *Act respecting elections and referendums in municipalities* and fulfills the following requirements:

- *a natural person domiciled in the municipality and for at least six (6) months domiciled in the Province of Quebec and*
 - *of full age and a Canadian citizen and not under curatorship.*
9. The sole property owner, who is not a resident of an immovable or sole occupant who is not a resident of a business establishment, who is not disqualified from voting, and fulfills the following requirements:
- *for at least twelve (12) months, is the owner of an immovable or sole occupant of a business establishment located in the municipality;*
 - *in the case of a physical person, be of full age and a Canadian citizen and not under curatorship.*
10. The undivided co-owner who is not a resident of an immovable or co-occupant who is not a resident of a business establishment, who is not disqualified from voting and fulfills the following requirements:
- *for at least twelve (12) months, is the undivided co-owner or co-occupant of a business establishment in the municipality;*
 - *be designated by the means of a power of attorney signed by the majority of the persons who are co-owners or co-occupants for at least twelve (12) months, as the person who has the right to be entered, on their behalf, on the referendum list. This power of attorney must be submitted before or at the time of signing the register.*
11. Moral person
- *a person designated by resolution, among the members, administrators or employees, who on April 3^d, 2018, and who at the time of exercising this right, is of full age, a Canadian citizen, not under curatorship or disqualified by law to vote.*
