



## Project to mobilize the Sutton community for local, sustainable and slow tourism receives a \$250,000 grant

Sutton, January 15, 2024—The Corporation de développement économique de Sutton (CDES) was awarded this grant as part of Destination durable et action concertée (DDAC), a support measure administered by the Fonds d'action québécois pour le développement durable (FAQDD) as part of the 2030 Plan for a Green Economy and the Responsible and Sustainable Tourism Plan 2020—2025.

Concerns about the future and economic vitality of today's tourism in the context of climate change, as well as tourism's environmental footprint, motivated this project. The Quebec government's move towards concerted planning in responsible and sustainable tourism is a great opportunity for the region. "We would like to thank the Minister of Tourism, Caroline Proulx, and the FAQDD for this great opportunity to work together in planning our tourism offer just as tourism is being redefined throughout Quebec," says Jeremy Fontana, President of the CDES.
