



## AMENDED PUBLIC NOTICE

### PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF DRINKING WATER

Due to the current drought and the critical decline in drinking water reserves,

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given by the undersigned:

**THAT** in accordance with section 7.15 of Bylaw No. 345 entitled “Bylaw on the use and preservation of drinking water” **and until further notice**,

**IT IS PROHIBITED, at ALL times and throughout the ENTIRE territory of the Town of Sutton:**

**TO WATER** lawns and landscaping, including newly planted areas;

**TO USE** any automatic watering system (these systems must be turned off);

**TO FILL** swimming pools, hot tubs, or decorative ponds;

**TO USE** residential splash pads, even those with low flow rates.

*Note: splash pads at the municipal pool remain available as they use a water recovery system.*

**TO WASH** vehicles, driveways, access roads, sidewalks, streets, patios, or exterior walls of buildings;

**TP ORGANIZE** car wash events or offer car wash services, whether free of charge or for a fee.

**Inspections will be carried out, and notices of violation including penalties may be issued in the event of non-compliance with this notice in accordance with the above-mentioned bylaw.**

*1. In the case of a natural person:*

- a) For a first offense, a fine of \$500 to \$1,000;*
- b) For a repeat offense, a fine of \$1,000 to \$2,000;*

*2. In the case of a legal person:*

- a) For a first offense, a fine of \$1,000 to \$2,000;*
- b) For a repeat offense, a fine of \$2,000 to \$4,000.*
